Introduction

Hong Kong University Alumni Association's (HKUAA) Student Members Group initiates the HKUAA Summer Mentorship 2010. We are pleased to invite your school to join the programme.

This is a community programme organized for the 4th year by HKUAA in which Young Alumni and Undergraduates from The University of Hong Kong (HKU) play a key role in sharing with secondary school students about the information and experiences of university life, hall life, academic and career prospects.

The programme is group-based. **Mentees will be recruited from the leading secondary schools.** They will be arranged in groups of three to four under the guidance of two to three **Mentors who will be HKU Young Alumni and Undergraduates.**

Objectives

Through organizing various academic-related and social activities, the programme aims to support students in gaining better understanding of university education, the university environment, choice of academic disciplines and future careers.

Mentees will be able to seek valuable advice from Mentors, some of whom are professionals in different fields. The mix of Mentors can help Mentees in their choice of studies at the university and their career planning.

Mentors and Mentees will be able to meet HKU Alumni, HKU Undergraduates, students from other secondary schools and possibly HKU Faculty Members and renowned guests.

Programme Highlights:

- This is a community programme organized for the 4th year by HKUAA.
- The programme provides Mentees with a good opportunity to get involved in university life and learn about the HKU culture.
- Mentors, who will be Mentees' supportive friends, are ready to give advice and guidance on academic study, university life and career development whenever needed.
- This is a comprehensive programme with cross curriculum and full-scale activities, ranging from academic to cultural events.
- The programme is **FREE OF CHARGE**. It will take place in mid July, 2010. Two mass gatherings are tentatively scheduled for two consecutive Saturday afternoons beginning from Jul 17, 2010. Group gatherings will be arranged by Mentors separately.
- The programme is opened to **Secondary 4 - 6 students** only.
- Candidates will be selected after a reviewing process that includes a self-introductory essay in 30 - 50 words. Please refer to the Application Form for instructions on writing the essay.
- Please attach a resume (optional) and a **recent photo** (required, can be non-passport photo).
- Successful candidates will be arranged in a **GROUP** of three to four Mentees under the guidance of two to three Mentors who are HKU Young Alumni and Undergraduates.
- Throughout the programme, HKUAA will provide a variety of academic-related and social activities which will enhance Mentees' understanding of university education and environment, as well as personal skills and future career development.
- All the activities will be **non-lecture based**. Mentees will have the opportunity to learn about university life at HKU through interactive discussions, seminar, university campus tour, hall visit, club's performance etc.
